#### 2.6 Innovative processes adopted by the Department in Teaching and Learning:

- Teachers of the Botany Department delivered most of the lectures using Power-point presentations.
   Animated clips of life cycles of plants and concepts in Molecular Biology were shown during lectures for better understanding.
- Department of Chemistry organized outdoor studies and surveys, study tours and camps to make the subject more effective. Power point presentations, films and softwares were used to explain the subject matter in a lucid way.
- In Department of Chemistry coaching was given to students for various competitive examinations like IIT entrance examination, SET/NET and University entrance examination. Lectures by eminent scientists, personalities were arranged for students. Workshops, seminars, quiz competitions were organized to provide suitable platform for the students. Faculty members along with the students regularly visit renowned institutes such as NCL, IISER which gives them opportunity to interact with the eminent scientists of these institutes. Allowing selected students for small projects by providing free references, chemicals and infrastructure which help them to explore independently new experiments using research instruments. Recommending reference books and journals as per their needs from PG as well as main library which furnish their acquired knowledge. To cherish their problem-solving abilities we provide them questionnaires as home assignments.
- Students were encouraged to participate in activities like "Avishkar" to motivate them to work on research projects and share their ideas
- Projects at UG and PG level inculcate the habit of independent thinking, teamwork and the ability to face challenges.
- Use of Quiz and Crosswords for different subjects is made along with regular teaching to know the subject in depth
- Computer science Department make use of ICT in delivering lectures at PG level, and also for demonstration of programs in the classroom.
- Department of Economics conducted Class tests/ Seminars, Field Visits, Guest Lecture, Group Discussions.
- Department of Electronics showed Demonstration of advanced electronic devices such as robot, CCTV, mobile, etc.
- Department of Zoology used over-head projector and charts while teaching. Conducted seminars and group discussions for students. Power point presentations, videos, animations were shown to the students.
- Department of History- Along with audio-visual teaching methods, inter and intra class debate competitions were conducted and competitive exam guidance was given to the students. History special students were taken on visits to different places of historical relevance. Ms. P P Dasture took the students on a visit to Sri Lanka to get them to know about the history, culture and political administration of the country; students were made to visit the Sri Lankan Parliament, where they got to interact with the Members of Parliament and the Prime Minister Mr Ranil Wickreme Singhe. History special students were also made to attend and present research papers at the 3<sup>rd</sup> Biennial Conference of the International Association for Asian Heritage, University of Kelaniya, Sri Lanka, to build in them a flare for historical research and public speaking. Students were also taken to attend and participate in workshops and

conferences, for example, Ms.P P Dasture took the history students of FY/SY/TY BA, to attend and participate in the 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Workshop on Explorations in Maharashtra, at the Centre for Archaeology in the Centre for Extra-Mural Studies, University of Mumbai, in order to know the latest happenings in the field of historical research. Field visits were also conducted to generate historical awareness. Ms.P P Dasture also took the history students on field visits to places of historical relevance in Pune and Maharashtra- to the Trishundya Ganpati, Shinde Chhatri, Shaniwarwada, Ajanta Ellora Cave, Daulatabad Fort , in order to inculcate a fondness for history.Dr J S Aniruddha and Ms. P P Dasture took the students to the Kesari Wada and the Pataleshwar Caves.

### **6.3.2** Teaching and Learning

• Standing Committee, Local Managing Committee and Heads of Departments together monitor the teaching-learning process in the College.

- Effective teaching is achieved by adopting several modern tools like Power-Point Presentations, open source software, films etc.
- Classroom attendance is taken regularly.
- Guest Lectures by eminent personalities are organised periodically by different departments for motivating the students, for guidance and for giving them a taste of cutting edge technology.
- The college has established regular contact with renowned Institutes like NCL, ARI, CMET, IISER Pune, IITM and IUCCA which the PG students visit regularly for project work. Students are exposed to a high level of research methodology and use of sophisticated instruments and facilities.
- Use of Quiz and Crosswords competitions for various subjects is made along with regular teaching to make learning of the subject enjoyable.

### **6.3.3** Examination and Evaluation

- The Senior College Examination Committee looks after all aspects of the Examinations.
- The college appoints a faculty as Chief Examination Officer who is In-charge and responsible for all aspects of the Examinations, both Internal as well as External.
- Continued use is made of Examination Module of Vriddhi software approved by the Savitribai Phule Pune University.
- We continued to adopt a uniform pattern of marking scheme for the Internal Examination. The 10 internal marks for semester pattern and 20 internal marks for yearly pattern are decided on the basis of 30 and 60 marks question papers respectively which are then appropriately scaled down. Objective as well as subjective questions are asked in these question papers which prepares students for the final university examination which improves their performance.
- Credit Grade Based Performance Assessment and continuous evaluation was introduced by the University for the first time in 2013-14 for PG students and is continued since then. At least two regular tests are conducted for every course. In addition to this, surprise test, open-book tests, home assignments, seminars, group discussions and extension work are also included. The students are given a fair chance to earn the 50 marks in Internals as a part of continuous evaluation. Our faculty members strive to evaluate the students in a transparent manner. A credit handbook is issued to every PG student so that each student has a detailed record of his/her evaluation.
- After every examination the paper setters write model answers to the questions before checking the answer sheets. These model answers are available for the students to go through in case of doubt. Answer sheets are checked after internal tests and shown to the students and their problems are addressed immediately.
- Many of the teaching Staff Members from the college are involved in examination work of the Savitribai Phule Pune University in various capacities.

## **6.3.4** Research and Development

- Many of our faculty members are recognised Ph. D. and M. Phil guides in Savitribai
  Phule Pune University and other Universities and they are actively involved in guiding
  students as well as faculties from other institutes as well. Several Departments of the
  college like Chemistry, Physics, Geography and Geology are recognized Research
  Centres of Savitribai Phule Pune University
- Our faculty members regularly attend conferences, symposia and workshops to keep abreast of the latest research and technology in their subjects. These conferences also help to create collaborations with faculties from other Institutes as well as to set up ties with other Institutions which in turn help with their work.
- The Heads of Departments encourage faculty members to take up minor and major research projects and some of them involve other members of the department as coinvestigators to give them an opportunity to know about research methodology.
- The English Department has a Research club for M.A. students wherein the students along with a faculty member read an original paper based on literary texts.
- College encourages students to participate in Avishkar, a State Level Inter- University Research Project Competition for UG/PG/ Doctoral students. This is done with the aim of improving their research and development skills.

## 6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

- There is sufficient provision in the College Budget for purchase of latest books etc. and
  the stipulated budget is utilised before the end of the financial year. The Library
  Committee monitors purchase of books, journals, encyclopaedias, e-books and ejournals.
- Each department has a separate Purchase Committee which monitors their requirements, procures and processes quotations and recommends the Principal to issue Purchase Orders for equipment etc. that is required.
- Most of the PG lectures are conducted using Power Point presentations.
- Some teachers give Assignments to their students by sending a group email to the students.
- Computerized Attendance System is developed in-house and is regularly used by some of the departments to maintain students' attendance for lectures throughout the year.
- Students make temporary websites for online registration of different events.
- Different departments encourage students to familiarize themselves with the use of ICT. For instance :

- a) The Electronics and Computer Science students use circuit simulators to test their designs.
- b) Electronics' students use CAD tools for PCB design (Electronics).
- c) Geography students use GPS instruments for practical experiments on mapping.
- d) Free Software is downloaded for the use of staff and students in the Mathematics department. Several other departments also follow this practice. Some of the open source software used in teaching which allow the students to do experimentation free of cost on their own are SCILAB, PSPICE, PHOENIX, TORA, LATEX, BIOEDIT, FASTA, BLAS and PHYLIP.
- e) E-books or research papers are downloaded from the internet and made available to the PG students.
- f) Exercises are given in the form of collecting information about a particular subject from internet. This makes students more aware and enables them to update their core knowledge of the concerned subject.
- g) Various departments use animations in their Power point presentations to explain difficult concepts.
- Several departments show Films of academic interest to the students.
- Dr. V. T. Borkar from Department of Chemistry prepared short films based on social awareness on key issues relevant to National interest like Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, eradication of blind faith etc. He was awarded with Certificate of Excellence for his short film "Speaking Hands" by Ministry of Information and Broadcasting and National Film Development Corporation Ltd.
- Lecture and Seminar competitions for students are arranged by many departments and students are encouraged to use ICT tools for them.
- Non-Teaching staff is given training in the use of computer software for office automation.

## **6.3.6** Human Resource Management

- Modern Education Society is a Teacher Managed Society, the Staff can openly express their views, put forth their difficulties and interact frequently with the Management.
- There are three elected Local Managing Committee members from amongst the teachers. These members aid and assist the Management in smooth running of the college in accordance with the Maharashtra University Act.
- Each Head of Department conducts regular meetings at the department level to monitor smooth functioning of the department as well as takes feedback from each staff member regarding completion of the portion, whether he/she needs to conduct extra lectures, concerns related to students, etc. In many departments like the Chemistry department which is the largest department of the college several committees like Program and Hospitality, Purchase committee, Placement committee etc. are operating regularly and records of meetings and activities are regularly operative. This helps the smooth day to day working of the departments.
- Heads of departments encourage and depute faculty for participating in different seminars, conferences and workshops.
- Discussions of assignments and laboratory experiments take place in each department at the beginning of each term.

- Sharing of Power Point presentations takes place among staff members.
- When new faculty members join a department, the senior staff members discuss
  assignments, laboratory experiments and explanations with them and ensure that students
  get correct and sufficient guidance regarding newly introduced concepts and technologies
  in the syllabus. Similarly the Power Point presentations for different subjects prepared by
  senior staff members are circulated amongst other staff members to ensure knowledge
  transfer.
- Coordinators for- Arts Circle, Students' Welfare, NSS, NCC, Anti-Ragging Cell, Mahatma Phule Adhyasan, Placement Cell, Samata Mandal, Women's Cell, Staff Academy, Examination Committee, Vigilance Committee, Gymkhana Committee, Discipline Committee, UGC Committee, Admissions Committee ensure smooth functioning of the College.
- To encourage and appreciate the good work done by the teachers, felicitation of teachers for excellence in work at the time of Scholar's Day and Gymkhana Day is carried out. Dr. M. V. Gokhale award and the Platinum Jubilee award have been specifically instituted for this purpose.

# **6.3.7** Faculty and Staff recruitment

- Modern Education Society carries out the actual Recruitment of Faculty and of Administration and Support Staff depending on the workload and availability of posts.
- Proper Selection procedures are in place for recruitment. Merit and reservation policies are strictly adhered to.
- IQAC monitors the academic progress of Teaching Staff by having a PBAS (Performance Based Appraisal System) and API inputs.

## **6.3.8** Industry Interaction / Collaboration

- Placement Cell/ Placement Officer in various Departments conduct appropriate training/ placement activity and training sessions for students in various industry-related activities
- Some Departments have Industrial training as part of the course work and students are placed in Industries for a short duration of up to one semester.
- Industry professionals are included as judges for different competitions.
- Industry experts are invited for guest lectures, seminars, workshops etc.
- Interaction is carried out with industries such as All Angels, Community Systems, Arxxus Cloud Solutions, Contensphere Technologies, Equations Work, E Technologies, Harbinger Group, Harbinger Systems Pvt. Ltd, Winsoft Technologies, Avon, Sai Biotech, Cipla, Jubiliant Chemsys, Pedilite and U. S. Vitamins.

### **6.3.9** Admissions of students

• Admission of students is entirely based on Merit and reservation criteria as per State Govt. Rules and there is complete transparency in the entire process.

- UG students are admitted on the basis of merit and senior staff members as well as Heads of Departments carry out the counselling activity during the admission process to ensure that good, motivated students confirm their admission.
- For many of the PG classes there is an Entrance Examination conducted and admissions
  are on the basis of performance in this examination and TY results. Senior staff members
  set the paper for the entrance examination paper based on aptitude as well as core subject
  knowledge. PG admissions are carried out with proper counselling and with total
  transparency.

### 6.4 Welfare schemes for :

## > Teaching and Non-Teaching Staff:

- In association with Sahyadri Hospital, the College had organised a Medical Check-up Camp in the College campus for teaching and non-teaching staff members. Some basic tests like blood sugar, BMI, Blood Pressure etc. were checked and the staff members were also counselled on individual basis for improving their health profile.
- Group Insurance Scheme is available for staff.
- General Provident Fund facility for all eligible staff.
- Modern Education Society's Employees' Credit Cooperative Society offers loans at very nominal rates.
- Short term i.e. emergency loan of Rs. 20,000/-
- Long term loan of up to Rs. 12,00,000/- @ 10% interest
- The Employees can also invest money in the Society in Fixed Deposits/ Recurring Deposits and get better returns than other non-equity financial products in the market.
- Free of charge Gymnasiums made available for Staff.
- Free of charge Dispensary on the campus is made available for Staff.
- Non-teaching staff working in various Laboratories are given adequate training in Laboratory and Equipment Maintenance to ensure safety of one and all concerned.

### > Students:

- The college conducts the Earn and Learn Scheme funded by the University for Economically Backward Class students.
- The college attracts a large number of visually impaired students.
- The Louis Braille Writers Club which is functioning in the college for the last 6 years continued to help visually impaired students. The students of our college as well as volunteers from the society in general assist the visually impaired students as writers during their exam. They also help them in their day to day college activities including reading out study material to them and ancillary tasks associated with their academics.
- The college helps socially and economically backward students for getting various scholarships.

- Free of charge Yoga training is provided to the students in the Yoga Hall.
- Free of charge Gymnasium is made available for students.
- Free of charge Dispensary on the campus is made available for students.

- Some prominent sportspersons who are alumni provide coaching in sports to the students.
- Provide feedback to start different courses depending on the need and demand of the Society and Industry
- On 15<sup>th</sup> April, 2017 the NWAA felicitated eminent academicians and politicians who are Alumni of the College. Among them was Deputy Mayor of Pune Late Navnath Kamble.

# **6.12** Activities and support from the Parent – Teacher Association

- The campus is very green and beautiful. Periodically, tree plantation is carried out to increase the green cover even further.
- Rain Water Harvesting has been continued on the campus.

- Compost pits have been dug up from which fertilizers are obtained periodically and used for the plants.
- Solar water heaters have been in use on the hostels.
- Solar panels have been in use for lighting the roads in the campus.
- Lectures are arranged for students as well as staff to increase awareness regarding environment.

The first batch of 14 students has been enrolled for training under this scheme. These students earn Rs. 3000/- pm at UG level and Rs. 15000/- pm at PG level. This is a significant contribution for the betterment of science education.

### 7.3 Give two Best Practices of the institution

7.3.1 The best practices which have contributed to the achievement of the Institutional Objectives and/or contributed to the Quality improvement of the core activities of the college are as follows-

# **Practice 1**

### a) Title:

Search for excellence from talented students

### b) Goal:

The purpose of this activity is to bring out the talent among meritorious young students in schools and give them scholarships for pursuance of their goals.

### c) The Practice

The Centre for Talent Search and Excellence conducts the prestigious Maharashtra Talent Search Examination (MTSE) for students studying in Std. VIII, IX and X

Classes. This year, 83,802 students appeared for this Examination. Students from 573 centres of various schools in Maharashtra, Goa and Karnataka appeared for the MTS Examination. Student Training Programs were organized at many places in Maharashtra for the preparation of Competitive examinations. Teacher Training Programs and Head Masters' Meetings were organised in several places in Maharashtra. The Examination was held on 23/04/17.

Graduate Excellence Examination (GEE) for students in their final year of graduation is conducted by the MTS. 272 students appeared for this examination on 05/02/17.

Pre-Medical and Engineering Entrance Examination was held for 306 students from 8 centres on 15/01/2017.

On behalf of Yashwantrao Chavan Academy of Development Administration (YASHADA) the MTS conducted examination for preparation of students for UPSC and MPSC examination for 5,461 students on 20/11/16. The YASHADA has entrusted the responsibility of selecting candidates for Maharashtra State Tribal Development (MSTDA) recruitment, to the MTS.

## d) Evidence of Success

Rs. 23 lakhs were awarded as prizes to 8,763 students. Prizes for the current years MTS Examination will be given in the next academic year.

## e) Problems encountered and Resources Required

Considering the large number of students enrolled for this project, we have to take assistance from various schools, junior and senior college teachers in the states of Maharashtra, Goa and Karnataka. This necessitated skilled manpower management and careful planning. For this, we generate our own resources by meticulous management.

## f) Context

This exercise prepares students for National Talent Search and Competitive Examinations.

## **Practice 2**

## a) Title:

Special Assistance to Visually Impaired Students.

#### b) Goal :

Considering the sizable number of visually impaired students every year in different classes and their special need while writing examinations, this special assistance is devised.

## c) The Practice:

The college attracts a large number of visually impaired students. The Louis Braille Writers Club which is functioning in the college for the last 6 years to help these students. The students of our college as well as volunteers from the society in general assist the visually impaired students as writers during their exams. They also help them in their day to day college activities including reading out study material to them and ancillary tasks associated with their academics. A computer lab has been set up in the college for visually impaired students in association with Technical Training Institute of

The Poona Blind Men's Association. Ten Computers are made available to the visually impaired students. A full time computer trainer has been appointed to teach computer to the visually impaired students.

### d) Evidence of Success:

Many of these students are benefitted in getting jobs in banks and computerized offices by clearing their examinations by this special assistance.

- **e) Problems encountered and resources required**: Special trainers are needed for this programme. They have to be hired from other institutions and transport has to be provided to them.
- **f)** Context: Writers for visually impaired students have to be provided by the parent institution as a part of their social commitment.

## 7.4 Contribution to environmental awareness / protection:

- Compost pits have been constructed behind the College ground for waste recycling.
- The college has been implementing an elaborate rain water harvesting project for some years now. The project involves all five institutions on the campus as a result of which the water level in the campus has registered a significant growth. Due to this, barring drinking water requirements, this project has taken care of all the campus water requirements. It has become a permanent source of water for all the institutions on the campus.
- More artificial bird nests have been put up on several trees on the Campus so as to increase the bird population
- Some of the gymnosperms grown and conserved on the campus are Podocarpus elongatus, Juniperous communis etc. Our campus has in all 6 genera of the 16 found in India.
- Tree plantations were carried out on several occasions during the year.

### 7.5 Whether environmental audit was conducted?

As a part of environmental awareness program, which is a compulsory subject under SPPU syllabus, S. Y. Students from all the departments undergo environmental conservation trainings. Under this initiative, the staff of Botany Department introduced the concept of In-house Green Audit to S. Y. students and other faculty members.

- Women's Forum: Internal complaint for prevention of sexual harassment of women at work place (under the Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal Act, 2013)
- Cell for atrocities and Anti-Ragging committees are in place.
- Mentoring programmes are conducted. Every faculty member interacts closely with a few students throughout the year mentoring them.

- The Electro Acoustics Research Laboratory was setup in the Department of Physics by Late Dr. H. V. Modak, Reader in the Department of Physics as early as 1971. The Laboratory has the unique distinction of being the first of its kind, where research is carried out in Indian Musical Acoustics. The Laboratory has now diversified to conduct Research in building acoustics and noise control Techniques, facilities for which have now been setup.
- Some of the faculty members from the Computer Science department are engaged in preparing lab books used by all computer Science (UG) students of Savitribai Phule Pune University.
- Most of the Faculty members from the college have been appointed by Savitribai Phule Pune University as paper setters, moderators and examiners.
- Many Faculty members have worked as subject experts for Staff interviews at several colleges.
- Many Faculty members have worked as judges for various competitions both within the college and in other colleges
- Many Faculty members have participated actively in the NSS camp held at Dongargaon.
- A one week period is earmarked where all departments have their departmental fests either Intra or Inter Collegiate. The college is abuzz with quiz and competitions of all sorts.
- There is a Post Office on the campus and Banking Facility is also available within the campus
- The college has well equipped research laboratories for Atmospheric Physics, electro Acoustics, Nuclear Physics, Organic Chemistry, Geology, Bio Technology, Nano Technology, Botany, Zoology etc.
- The college boasts of a very big library with over one lakh books. A huge reading room and separate reading cubicles for staff are available.
- Doctor is available in the dispensary on the campus. Students and staff may avail of this facility free of cost.
- Debating Society: The following are the activities conducted by the College Debating Society:
- 1) Elocution Competition: An Elocution Competition was conducted in the college in which students of Junior, Senior and PG classes participated.
- 2) An Extempore Speech Competition was conducted in the college during January 2017.
- The Late Mayadevi Chandanlal Sethi Trophy Quiz Competition was conducted this year on 6thFebruary 2017.
- The College also conducted the prestigious annual inter collegiate H. H. The Raja of Sangli's Gokhale Cup Elocution Competition on 2nd February 2017.
- The college attracts a large number of International students over 10 to 12 countries. The college has a Foreign Students Forum, which guides and helps the foreign students in various aspects.
- Our Campus has zero tolerance for eve teasing.
- There is total ban on smoking and tobacco chewing in the campus.
